ARTISTS' DRAWINGS, ESSAYS AND PROOFS OF THE 1948 DO'AR IVRI ISSUE OF ISRAEL

This exhibit traces the DEVELOPMENT of the designs for Israel's first postage stamps. When these stamps were designed, the name of the new country and its currency had not yet been decided. Three artists were asked to submit designs but only the identity of two have been determined. In late 1947, OTTO WALLISH submitted designs showing symbols of the Jewish settlement of Palestine and inscribed in Hebrew YEHUDA. These designs were not accepted, and, in late March, April 1948, he submitted a series showing ancient Jewish coins from the time of Macabee Revolution (167-160 BC). From the 15 mil value, a silver shekel, showing a ritual cup (later incorporated in the 20 mil definitive stamp) a block of four was made in black, then blue and red.

Next, the coin designs of the Yehuda Essays were redrawn with the inscription changed to ERETZ ISRAEL in Hebrew and Arabic and the figure 15 changed to 5. The SHAMIR BROTHERS also submitted four designs; one represented a large photoessay; a second previously unknown stamp size photoessay with symbols of agriculture, industry and production, and also two menorah designs, one of which has not been illustrated until exhibited by this collector. WALLISH'S coin design was accepted and was produced in four types and seven colors. In addition, they exist imperf, perf 10.8, and pinperf.

On May 2, 1948, the designs of seven stamps, 3 mil- 250 mil, all using different coin designs were selected. The stamps were simply inscribed DO'AR IVRI in Hebrew at the top, meaning Hebrew Post, and the same, in Arabic, at the bottom. The value is expressed in numerals only. Descriptive tabs were attached to the stamps at the bottom row of the printing plate in order to render the ancient coin description in modern Hebrew. The designs for the 500 and 1000 mil were chosen several days later. Printing began May 4, 1948; the first issue went on sale on May 16, 1948 as Independence, declared May 15 was a Saturday.



Presentation Sheets in light blue, orange red, and chocolate brown (The Mosden examples) but without an inscription are forgeries.

This block is a brighter shade of blue than the normal blue on thin yellow paper. It's size is slightly larger than the issued sheet and under high magnification (8x) the following differences are noted:

- a. the Hebrew Font has a very sharp dark margin rather than a fuzzy edge
- b. The semicolons are very sharp and diamond shaped rather than tear drops.




Magenta Doar Ivri Color Trial of 10 mil Value "Broadway Sheet" Signed: Wallish




Red Doar Ivri Color Trial of 15 mil Value "Broadway Sheet"


