RECORDS

THIS PHOTOGRAPH OF THE DIE RECORDS SHOWS THAT THE SEAL DIE WAS ENGRAVED BY PEASE AND WAS PROOVED AUG. 22, 1865. STAMPS COULD NOT HAVE BEEN SENT TO NEWFOUNDLAND UNTIL SEPTEMBER AT THE EARLIEST. BECKWITH ENGRAVED THE 2¢ CODFISH STAMP WAS PROOVED AND SENT TO THE TRANSFER DEPARTMENT THE SAME DAY. NOTE DIE NUMBERS WERE ASSIGNED AT THIS TIME.

THE NEW HANDSTAMPS FOR THE 10¢ AND 13¢ RATES DID NOT APPEAR UNTIL AFTER ENFORCEMENT OF THE PENALTY FOR UNDERPAID LETTERS ON 15 NOVEMBER 1865. THE STAMPS WERE ALSO USED FOR RATING LETTERS FROM THE UNITED STATES WITH PROPER POSTAGE - 10¢ TO ST. JOHN'S AND 13¢ TO THE INTERIOR.







### POSTOFFICE WAYBILL

A WAYBILL, SUCH AS THIS ONE FROM LA POILE, ACCOMPANIED EACH DISPATCH OF LETTERS. IF A REGISTERED LETTER WAS INCLUDED IT WAS WRAPPED IN A SEPERATE GREEN REGISTERED LETTER SHEET AND THE ADDRESS WAS NOTED ON THE WAY BILL. ALL LETTERS WERE NOTED WITH THE TIME DISPATCHED AND RECEIVED. LA POILE BECAME A WAY OFFICE IN 1860 AND ALSO HAS ONE OF THE FEW DISTINCTIVE TOWN STAMPS

ENGRAVERS PASTE UP



THIS IS THE ORIGINAL DESIGN FROM WHICH ALL OF THE BANK NOTES FOR THE COMMERCIAL BANK OF NEWFOUNDLAND WERE COPIED. THE CODFISH IS AN ESSAY DRAWN BY WILLIAM SALTER IN PENCIL. AS CAN BE SEEN IT WAS CUT FROM THE PASTE UP AND USED BY JEENS AS THE MODEL FOR HIS ENGRAVING. IT WAS THEN REPLACED. THE SEAL IS AN OVAL PORTION OF THE 5¢ 1865 STAMP, CUT AND MOUNTED ON A PAPER BACK, THE TOP BORDER COVERED WITH A THIN PIECE OF PAPER AND THE WHOLE THEN PASTED ON ONE OF THE STANDARD PERKINS BACON OVALS. THE BASIC DESIGN BY PEASE, DONE FOR THE AMERICAN BANK NOTE CO. WAS COPIED BY JEENS FOR THIS SERIES OF BANK NOTES. THE ENGRAVING BY JEENS IS AN ALMOST IDENTICAL COPY, ESPECIALLY FOR SIZE, BUT VARIES IN MINUTE DETAIL.





**Articles of Agreement** made the Twenty-first day of August, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and Seventy-two, between the Government of Newfoundland, represented by JAMES L. NOONAN, Colonial Secretary, of the first part, and HUGH & ANDREW ALLAN, of the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, in the Dominion of Canada, represented by Sir HUGH ALLAN, (hereafter described as the Contractors,) of the second part: **Witness** that the said HUGH & ANDREW ALLAN do hereby covenant with the Government of Newfoundland and its Successors, in the manner following, that is to say:—

1.—The Contractors will faithfully convey, or cause to be conveyed, by good and sufficient Steam Vessels, all Her Majesty's Mails, (which designation shall, for the purposes of this Contract, be considered as including all Bags, Boxes, or Packets of Letters, Newspapers, Books, or Printed Papers, and all other articles, transmissible by Post,) from the Port of Liverpool in England, or Queenstown in Ireland, to the Port of St. John's, in Newfoundland, on the First Wednesday in every month, during nine months of the year, on which the Steamer shall sail for Halifax, or on such other day or days as may be from time to time agreed upon for the time being: and from St.

## MEMORANDUM

Shewing the alterations to be made on the 1st April, 1879, in the rates of postage and conditions of transmission of correspondence of various kinds between the United Kingdom and the Colony of Newfoundland in consequence of the new Postal Convention signed at Paris on the 1st June, 1878, for the revision of the Treaty of Berne constituting the General Postal Union.

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### LETTERS.

Insufficiently prepaid letters will be charged on delivery with double the amount of the deficiency of the prepaid rate, instead of, as at present, with the unpaid rate less the value of the stamps affixed.

### POST CARDS.

The issue of Post Cards will no longer be optional as heretofore.

The postage for each card will be 1d., instead of 1½d. Prepayment is compulsory.

Post Cards must not exceed the following dimensions:—

	inches.
Length, 14 Centimetres	= 5½
Width, 9            "	= 3½

They must bear the superscription "*Universal Postal Union*" followed by the name of the Colony (to be repeated in the French language).

### OTHER ARTICLES.

Commercial Papers, of which a definition will be found in Article XVI. of the Detailed Regulations appended to the Postal Convention, must be prepaid 2½d. for a packet of any weight not exceeding 4 ounces, and for a packet exceeding the weight of 4 ounces, a further postage of a half-penny must be paid for every additional 2 oz.

The postage for Books and all other Printed Papers (except Newspapers) will be reduced from 1d. to a half-penny per two ounces. Patterns or Samples will be chargeable with a minimum rate of 1d. for a packet not exceeding 2 ounces in weight, with the addition of a half-penny for every 2 ounces in excess. Any of the above articles may be sent together in one packet, but if Commercial Documents or Patterns are included, the postage applicable to such articles must be paid for the whole packet.
