The GUY (Colonization) Issue - Engraved

The engraved stamps of the Colonization (GUY) Issue have always been somewhat mystery. The original Guy stamps were purchased as part of a five year supply by Whitehead Morris, subsequent to negotiations which began October 25, 1909. Full particulars concerning the value of the stamps, the quantities, and the designs were contained in a letter dated April 4, 1910. Deliveries were required by no later than the end of July. Previous correspondence had established that Newfoundland was satisfied with the ENGRAVED stamps of the American Bank Note Company, and that they desired the new stamps to be engraved and again printed in sheets of 100 each.

Curious variations from the detailed instructions ensued, evidently from a lack of attention to detail by Whitehead Morris, and a lack of information concerning the capabilities of W/M in Newfoundland. Whitehead Morris never had the ability to produce engraved stamps by themselves. They were stationers, and while they did have perforating equipment, they could only Lithograph stamps. They could not even prepare the required dies. The Lithographed Colonization (GUY) Issue began arriving in Newfoundland so late, that only the 6¢ and 2¢ stamps could be placed on sale in very limited quantities on August 12th, the day of the 300th anniversary of Guy's landing began.

Another mistake became apparent on August 25th, when a package containing a second shipment of 100 sheets of 6¢ stamps appeared, unannounced and unsolicited. Why? To correct an apparent error! The letters with instructions to W/M, all used the spelling of Colonization with a "Z". References to illustrations to be used by W/M, directed them to various pages of The First Edition of Prowse's History of Newfoundland. In this book the spelling of Colonisation used an "S". The engraver followed the book, the company finally detected the error, corrected it on the plate and sent new stamps to St. John's.

Evidently sensing unhappiness in Newfoundland, Mr. Morris, embarked on September 10th for St. John's, probably arriving about the 15th or 16th. What was discussed is unknown, but Mr. Morris returned home bearing whatever instructions had been conveyed to him. Probably the lack of engraved stamps, was paramount. The correspondence is mute from early December until February 7, 1911 when instructions were issued for final payment of all open invoices received for this issue. Production orders rescued from the bombing of Whitehead Morris in 1940, indicate the quantities of sheets of the high value stamps which were not engraved and were to be perforated on December 29, 1910. They were then shipped to St. John's early in January 1911.

Initially these stamps were believed to have been produced by De La Rue. Later research, even though all the records of Whitehead Morris had been destroyed in the bombing of St. John's and the company merged with another, definitely show that the dies had been made by McDonalds, also known as The London Bureau of Engraving, and printed by Alexander's. Initially the dies were etched, rather than cut with engraving tools, which would be unsatisfactory for Lithograph printing. When engraved stamps were required, the dies were recut with the proper tools, and the transfers made. Possibly these stamps were printed from copper plates, rather than iron as used by Perkins-Bacon. More on this later.

The proofs and stamps of this re-issue, have their interesting varieties. They were printed on sometimes watermarked paper, they exist imperforate and part perforate, and color trials are known on partially inked sheets. Some presentation pages were adorned with die proofs. Evidently an afterthought, prepared to correct a misinterpretation of a customer's order, they are an interesting limited addition to a commemorative issue.




