This article is a comment on the section entitled "Products of the Plate numbered one penny and two pence Stamps with four in" Supplement to the line engraved Postage Stamps of Great Britain printed by Perkins Bacon & Co" by Edward Penny Bacon CVO

There appears to be ~~no satisfactory reason given for~~ ~~twenty-four~~ "mysterious" dies having been made, and ~~the~~ ~~whole~~ number of passages ~~indicate~~ considerable doubt as to the proposals made and the method employed ~~for changing~~ ~~the~~ ~~dies~~ in the stamps at this time. Particularly in this case To quote a few ^{passages} "...Even with the new information we have now of we are quite unable to understand for what technical reason many dies were made" "did the father and the son disagree as to the best method of carrying out the work?"

"Whether this requirement has any bearing on the making of the new One Penny dies, whose purpose we do not fully understand, do not know" "the description ... given by Messrs Philbrick & W... does not help us in any way ... the terms used in the description are confusing." "..... but we are unable to understand why modification was made in the number of the flat dies."

THE PERKINS BACON RECORDS - VOL I PP 100 - 101 DESCRIBES THE PREPARATION OF THE ABOVE PLATES FROM THE BLANK DIE OF THE ONE PENNY TO THREE PENNY VALUES OF NEW SOUTH WALES, AND THEIR USE AS EXPERIMENTAL PLATES. PIGMENTS AND PAPERS WERE 'TRIED OUT' AND SOME IMPRESSIONS WERE MADE AS COLOR TRIALS FOR OTHER COLONIES. THE PLATE WAS COMPLETED BETWEEN MARCH AND MAY 1855.

THE NOTE ON THE SHEET ABOVE SHOWS THAT IT WAS PRINTED 22 SEPTEMBER 1856. THE NEWFOUNDLAND STAMPS WERE PRINTED 27 SEPTEMBER. NO OTHER COLONIAL STAMPS WERE PRINTED UNTIL THE RED TRINIDAD STAMP ON 22 NOVEMBER, AND THEN THE BLUE AND GREEN CEYLON STAMPS ON 31 JANUARY 1857. THESE COLOR TRIALS MUST BE THOSE FOR NEWFOUNDLAND, AND REPRESENT THE 1^D (VIOLET BROWN) THE 5^D (VIOLET BROWN), THE 3^D (GREEN) AND THE SIX OTHER VALUES (SCARLET VERMILION).

THE LAID PAPER UPON WHICH THE TRIALS ARE MOUNTED APPEARS TO BE IDENTICAL WITH THAT USED FOR THE PRINTING OF THE 1^{SH} ORANGE VERMILION ON VERTICAL LAID PAPER, IN 1860.

DIE I

DIE I WAS FIRST RECOGNIZED IN 1965. CHARACTERISTICS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. LOWER LEFT "3" SLANTS TO THE LEFT
2. THERE IS A VERTICAL LINE IN THE RIGHT CENTER OF THE TREFOIL ORNAMENT EXTENDING THROUGH THE UPPER "3"

DIE II

TWO IMPRESSIONS OF DIE II WERE USED TO MAKE THE FINAL DIE. FOR MANY YEARS THIS WAS THE ONLY DIE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN PRODUCED.



CHARACTERISTICS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

1. THE "3s" ARE THICKER AND HAVE A LONGER BALL AT THE LOWER END.

DELIVERY OF LETTERS.

THE Postmaster General, anxious to promote rapidity and correctness in the delivery of Letters, has, for postal purposes, divided London and its environs into TEN DISTRICTS, each to be treated, in many respects, as a separate town; and, to render this arrangement effectual, he earnestly requests that every means may be taken by the Public for causing Letters to be directed *according to the District for which they are intended*. Initials will suffice; and for the house at which this notice is left the initials are W. C. the District being the WESTERN CENTRAL. In the direction of a Letter, these initials should be legibly written in a separate line, and should in all cases end the address, thus:—
