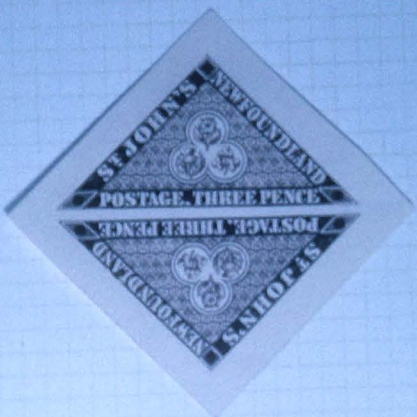

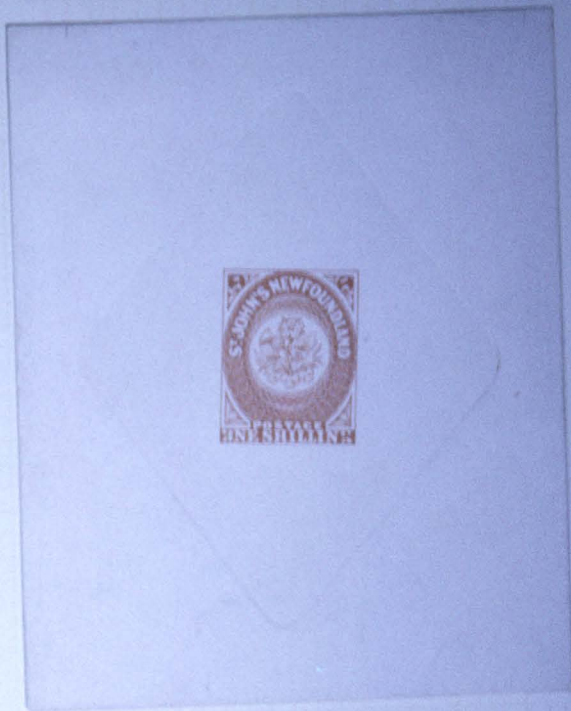
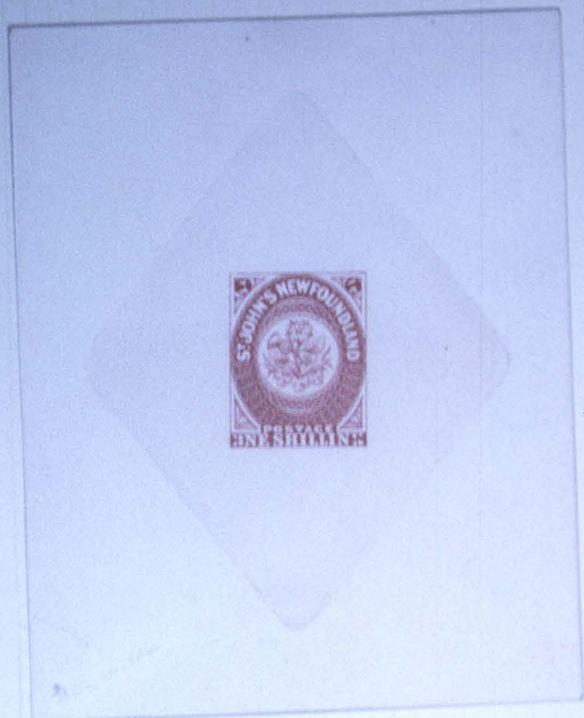

LETTER POSTMASTER GENERAL WILLIAM SOLOMON TO THE COLONIAL SECRETARY

ON 11 JULY 1856 HE ADVISED THAT POSTAGE STAMPS HAD BEEN ORDERED

FROM MR. STANFORD OF LONDON, STATIONER

THEY ARRIVED IN LATE NOVEMBER,

AND WERE ISSUED 1 JANUARY 1857

THE PERKINS BACON RECORDS - VOL I PP 100 - 101 DESCRIBES THE PREPARATION OF THE ABOVE PLATES FROM THE BLANK DIE OF THE ONE PENNY TO THREE PENNY VALUES OF NEW SOUTH WALES, AND THEIR USE AS EXPERIMENTAL PLATES. PIGMENTS AND PAPERS WERE 'TRIED OUT' AND SOME IMPRESSIONS WERE MADE AS COLOR TRIALS FOR OTHER COLONIES. THE PLATE WAS COMPLETED BETWEEN MARCH AND MAY 1855.

THE NOTE ON THE SHEET ABOVE SHOWS THAT IT WAS PRINTED 22 SEPTEMBER 1856. THE NEWFOUNDLAND STAMPS WERE PRINTED 27 SEPTEMBER. NO OTHER COLONIAL STAMPS WERE PRINTED UNTIL THE RED TRINIDAD STAMP ON 22 NOVEMBER, AND THEN THE BLUE AND GREEN CEYLON STAMPS ON 31 JANUARY 1857. THESE COLOR TRIALS MUST BE THOSE FOR NEWFOUNDLAND, AND REPRESENT THE 1<sup>D</sup> (VIOLET BROWN) THE 5<sup>D</sup> (VIOLET BROWN), THE 3<sup>D</sup> (GREEN) AND THE SIX OTHER VALUES (SCARLET VERMILION).

THE LAID PAPER UPON WHICH THE TRIALS ARE MOUNTED APPEARS TO BE IDENTICAL WITH THAT USED FOR THE PRINTING OF THE 1<sup>ST</sup> ORANGE VERMILION ON VERTICAL LAID PAPER, IN 1860.

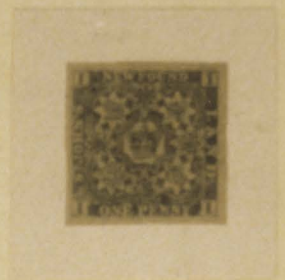

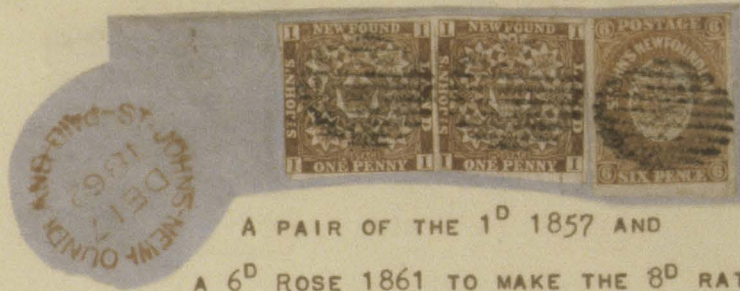

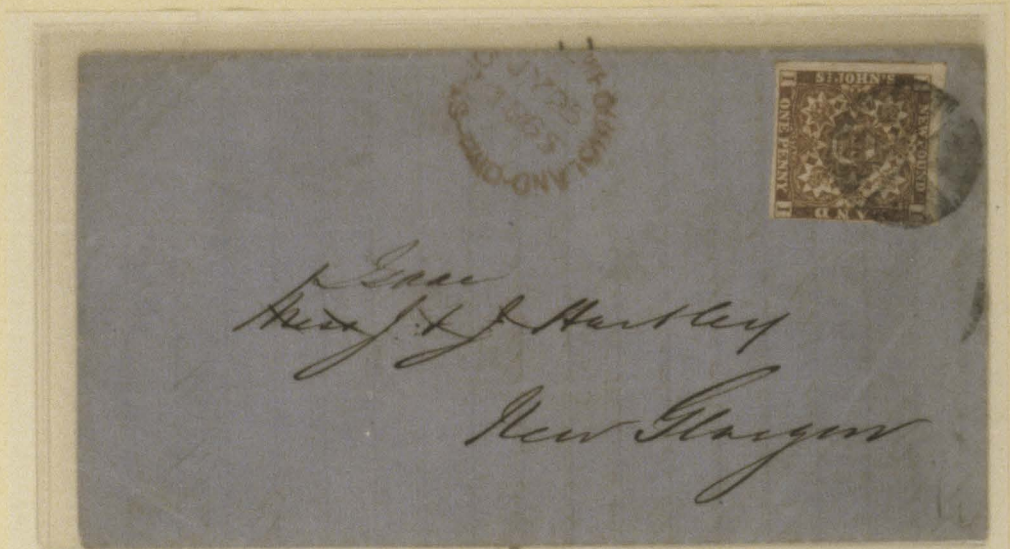

TOO MANY OF THE 1<sup>D</sup> WERE PRINTED IN 1856 AND THERE WERE REMAINDERS WELL INTO THE 1870'S. COMBINATIONS USING THE 1<sup>D</sup> STAMP ARE EVIDENT AFTER 7 APRIL 1865 WHEN "CENTS" RATES WERE ENFORCED. NO CENTS STAMPS WERE AVAILABLE UNTIL 15 NOVEMBER AND WERE THEN SPARCELY USED.

A 1<sup>D</sup> STAMP IS MISSING FROM THIS LETTER. THE 6<sup>D</sup> STG. PACKET RATE TO ENGLAND WAS IN FORCE, HOWEVER ALL OF THE 6<sup>D</sup> SCARLET VERMILION STAMPS WERE EXHAUSTED BY THIS TIME. EITHER THE SENDER WAS UNAWARE THAT THE RATE THROUGH THE UNITED STATES COST MORE OR HE HAD DECIDED TO SENT THE LETTER IN A NORMAL WAY. THE 5<sup>D</sup> AND BISECT 2<sup>D</sup> OR A 1<sup>D</sup> WOULD PAY THE 6<sup>D</sup> RATE. THE RATE THROUGH THE U.S. WAS 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub><sup>D</sup> STG. FROM AN OUTPORT, PLUS THE 1/- RATE COLLECT FROM THE U.S. GOING BY AMERICAN PACKET THE 1/- RATE WAS DEVIDED 21¢ TO THE U.S. AND 3¢ TO ENGLAND. AS THERE WERE NEVER ANY 1/2<sup>D</sup> STAMPS PRINTED, THE POSTOFFICE AT HARBOR GRACE WOULD REQUIRE A 1<sup>D</sup> STAMP TO BE AFFIXED AND IT SEEMINGLY ACCEPTED THE BISECT 2<sup>D</sup> WITHOUT QUESTION.

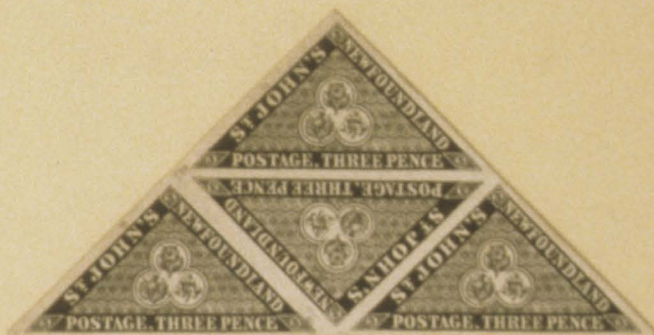

TO UNDERSTAND THE 1861 ISSUE OF ROSE STAMPS ONE MUST BE AWARE THAT THE JUNE PRINTINGS WERE ORDERED THROUGH NORMAL CHANNELS BY THE COLONIAL SECRETARY. A SHORTAGE OF COMMONLY USED STAMPS DEVELOPED WHEN THIS ORDER DID NOT ARRIVE IN ST JOHN'S BY EARLY FALL 1861 DUE TO AN ABORTED VOYAGE BY THE S. S. LIVINGSTON. THE POSTMASTER GENERAL, BY THEN DESPERATE FOR STAMPS, BYPASSED THE COLONIAL SECRETARY AND PLACED THE SECOND ORDER FOR STAMPS. THEY WERE PRINTED IN MID NOVEMBER.

FOR SOME UNKNOWN REASON BOTH ORDERS WERE THEN SENT TO NEWFOUNDLAND TOGETHER AND ARRIVED EARLY IN JANUARY 1862. THE POSTMASTER GENERAL WAS REPRIMANDED BY THE COLONIAL SECRETARY FOR HIS ACTIONS AND THE LONDON CONTRACTOR TOLD NEVER TO ACCEPT FURTHER ORDERS FROM THE POSTMASTER GENERAL. FUTURE ORDERS FOR STAMPS IN 1865 WENT TO THE AMERICAN BANK NOTE CO.

THERE IS NO KNOWN WAY FOR THE GENERAL PHILATELIST TO EASILY DISTINGUISH BETWEEN THE TWO PRINTINGS. THE "CANCELLED" STAMPS PREPARED FOR ROWLAND HILL ARE THE ONLY KNOWN IDENTIFYABLE ROSE STAMPS OF THE JUNE PRINTING. THE 8<sup>D</sup> IS THE ONLY KNOWN IDENTIFYABLE ROSE STAMP OF THE NOVEMBER PRINTING, TO WHICH THE LIGHTER COLORED PRINTINGS ARE NORMALLY ASSIGNED. THE 1<sup>D</sup> AND 5<sup>D</sup> WERE ONLY PRINTED IN NOVEMBER.
