

Sir,

The foregoing is copy of my last Letter to you the 27th June in a due England this I write upon an uncertainty as I don't know what way a Vacancy may offer for forwarding it but I will send it to St Johns to be ready for the post by itself that may forward it

I am sorry to tell you of my last Voyage which was owing to bad weather in the Officers of the Ship the Master of this by name James Webb Esq^r was in command of said ship and was driven from St Johns was fasted in the night on board of Captain Gold's Ship that was bound here at the same time with provisions to sell and the crew very many of them being the first person that they ever had lost in this Harbour to my sorrow they seized all the goods and company that was on board you I mean except the White Linnen, Salt, Iron, other things papers by the way that remained here in the winter, and they seized all the books they looted me of my own Books, of several papers in my pocket books, all the happenings in the port of July last the same day they seized two full boxes of Gunpowder and heard the same Industry which you know was for the Crown Expanding the Voyage

The seventh day of July they seized the Snow Industry of look very well built & rigging out of the Store, rigged her and raised her round to St Johns before she was unladen, and the same Seals and rigging none of them know what Express they belonged to, and the twenty eight of July she was condemned and the goods also

They had no proof to condemn the said Express but that they found the above mentioned candles on board, and supposing some bills of Lading & Invoices that they got among the papers they looted me of, to be the original papers & that without any Proof

That of July when they seized said Snow I went to Charles Ireland Esq^r at St Johns to have it grounded properly which I hope you may be

Sir I arriv'd here last wednes day & found a Lett^r from John Ferry my agent in Newfoundland of which the Annexed is Copy by which you will observe the Cruel Treatment us'd with my property in that Country.

I beg the Favour of you to Interest your self for me in this affair as far as your own Judgment to find out if the party's have acted according to Law, I shall wonder very much if forcing away Books & Papers, besides the Rigging as represented in the Annexed, be consistent wth the Law of a Free Nation.

Supposing these Papers found in the Agents Pocket Book, contain'd Bills, Ladings and Invoices of said Contraband Goods, the question is whether that can be sufficient proof that the goods found is the goods described in said papers, tho' they should, quere if the ship was liable as they were not found on Board, besides the unjust manner of coming at such proof may waken the Steps founded thereon.

Please to consider, that the Loss of the ship is less than the Disappointment by the Interruption of her Voyage so that I must sue for a considerable deal more than her Value if I do for any Sum, provided I find it prudent to commence a Law suit against the Agresors, which you will Inform me when you get at a thorough knowledge of the part I am to take. I expect you will procure the best advice (not depend entirely on your own) for which I will be accountable to you, I beg you will loose no time herein as I believe the officers &c, will soon make their appearance at Home, but suppose em all left or detain'd abroad, what course then is to be taken if the Lieutenant, does not appear is not the Captⁿ of the man War accountable for the offence committed by him, the same Rule some should be answerable for a Captⁿ if he continues out of sight pray Search into every particular, for I think setting out right is the work. I conceive upon the whole that no proof can be made on a Court of Justice but by some party's that would swear that the very goods carry'd from hence in said ship, which seems was out at large at the Tryal when she was Condemn'd, otherwise my agent would take notice of it in his Lett^r. The latter part of said Letter is of no use to you the purpose ends at this mark ✓. please to shew this affair to Mr Edward Trenchard if he can be of service he will not grudge his assistance, I pray Labour the point for I must sue for a large Sum for the ship & Damage, I am heartily

Sir

The foregoing is copy of my last Letter to you the 27th June via New England, this I write upon an uncertainty as I don't know which way a Vacancy may offer, for forward it, but I will send to St. John's to be ready for the first Vessel that may forward it

I am sorry to tell you of my last Success which was owing to bad weather in the Officers of the Antelope, Man of War by order of James Webb Esq^r commander of said ship, came round here from St. John's unexpected in the night on board of Captain Gales's Sloop, that was bound here at the same time with provisions to sell, and he was very heavy on me. Being the first person that they overhauled in this Harbour, to my sorrow, they seized all the goods in company with you. The goods of me, except the White Linnen, Sill, French stuffs, paper & the Wiggs that remained here in the winter, and they seized all the leather, they looted me of my acc^d Books, & of severall papers in my pocket book, all this happened on the first of July last the same day seized two full boxes of two tlll aged Boxes of Candles on board the Snow Industry which you know was for her own Expending the Voyage

The seventh day of July they seized the Snow Industry & took very all Sails & Rigging out of the Store, rigged her and carried her round to St. John's, before she was condemned, and the same Sails and Rigging none of them know what Vessel they belonged to, and the twenty eight of July she was condemned and the goods also

They had no proof to condemn the said Vessel but that they found the above mentioned candles on board, and supposing some Bills of Lading & Invoices that they got among the papers they looted me of, to be the original papers, & that without any Proof the 1st of July when they seized said Snow, I went to Charles Garland Esq^r to protest, & to morrow I will have it grounded properly, which I hope you may receive copies by as I am informed by Severall

The same people Seized Moses Pith's Brig, some of the Knowles shoes in the possession of Richard Walsh, Glacentic, some sweet Oil, and Kalls from Capt Pike's house, Leather from Mr Felix McCarthy, Soap from Webb & some Cloathing & several Others. The price of Fish is broke at Sixteen Shillings per Quintal, the price of Goods as they were last year, as for the price of Oil I don't know as yet what men proved here but very indifferent as concerning the fishery, and for that reason I don't keep them any longer, except one boat's crew as I could do without comfortably

I was about purchasing the Snow Industry, I offered three hundred pounds, and could purchase her for that, now I am greatly at a loss having no money to carry the fish away, whether I am better to sell the Goods for fish or beer, I don't know but if I can procure a night, will convert, about two thirds into Oil, and the remainder, in bills of Exchange, there's no call for provisions as yett, but hope for all that I will make Sale of all I have, there is no call fish for bill, Vessels being Scarce in the Bay, Captain Lawrence Kearns who is very sorry for your loss. I wish some in our respects to you & Mr Gauls,

Your Boat has Catched I believe about Twenty Quintals of fish, your Goods were condemned for Sale, as per Invoice hereunder, was sold at a publick Auction for an Inch of Candle in four lots, & as Mr Felix McCarthy was so good as to offer his Service in drawing what bills I should want to purchase your Goods on

"IN REPLY TO YOUR LETTER OF THE 23RD, I CAN ONLY REPEAT WHAT WAS PREVIOUSLY DECIDED UPON, THAT NO NEW STAMPS ARE TO BE ISSUED UNTIL THE OLD ISSUE IS EXHAUSTED. WHEN THE OLD FIVE CENTS ARE OUT THE NEW FIVE CENTS SHOULD COME INTO CIRCULATION, BUT NOT BEFORE."

THE INITIAL SHIPMENT OF 5¢ ROYAL ISSUE STAMPS WAS RECEIVED 6 AUGUST 1898. 104,569 STAMPS OF THE 5¢ VALUE PRINTED IN 1887 WERE DESTROYED 4 JANUARY 1900. BETWEEN NOV 1899 AND JAN 1900, 4431 OF THE OLD 5¢ STAMPS WERE SOLD BY THE POSTOFFICE. DESTROYED ON THE SAME DATE WERE 11,342 OF THE 5¢ CABOT ISSUE STAMPS

LETTER FROM MARGARET PARILL, ST MARGARETS BAY, SHOAL COVE WEST TO JAMES BAIRD LTD, ST JOHN'S. CARRIED ON THE RAILWAY MOTOR VESSEL CLARENVILLE WHICH COLLIDED WITH THE PAPER BOAT S.S. KELLOWNA PARK OFF MEADOWS' POINT, BAY OF ISLANDS AT 8:00 P.M. ON THE EVENING OF 29 NOVEMBER 1945. THE CREW AND EIGHT PASSENGERS ABANDONED THE SHIP AND RETURNED TO CORNER BROOK ON THE PAPER BOAT WHICH HAD BEEN OUTWARD BOUND. THE CLARENVILLE WAS THE FIRST OF THE GOVERNMENT WOODEN FLEET TO COME OFF THE STOCKS AT THE CLARENVILLE YARDS AND WAS CHRISTENED THERE ON 12 APRIL 1944 BY LADY WALWYN. 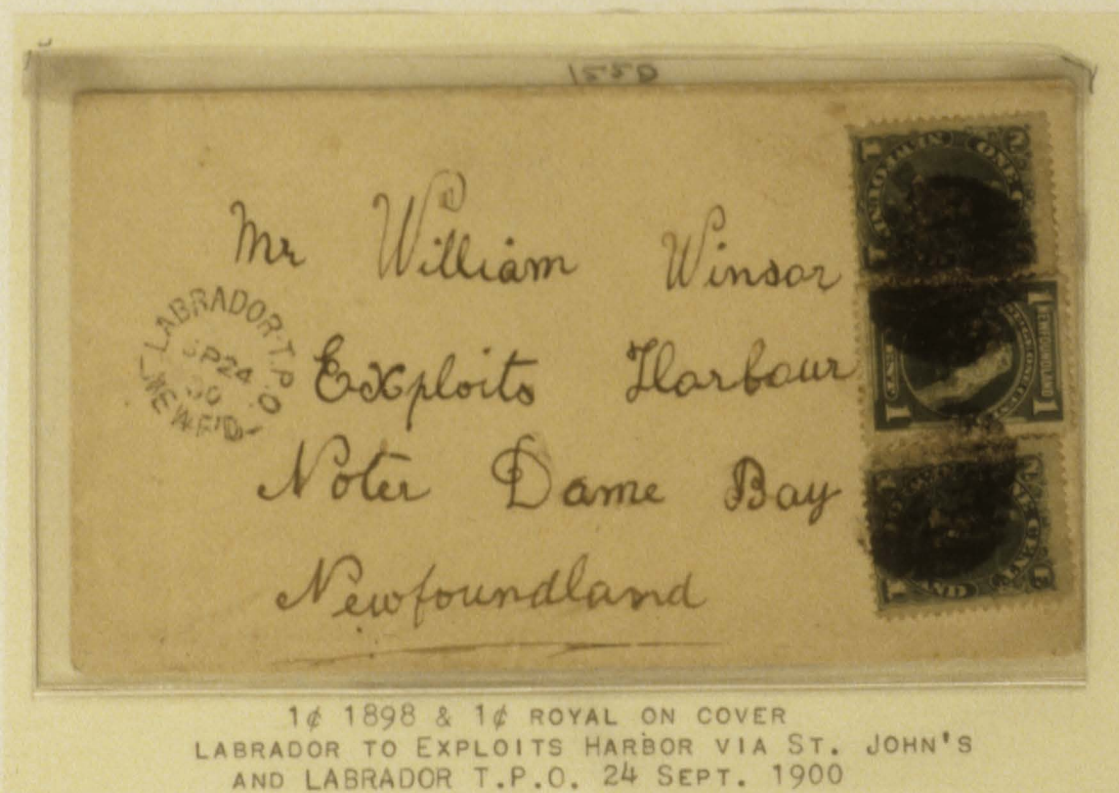
